Make you some pancakes. Remember your first breakfast in our house. Let us out of bed but would love doing it a gain.



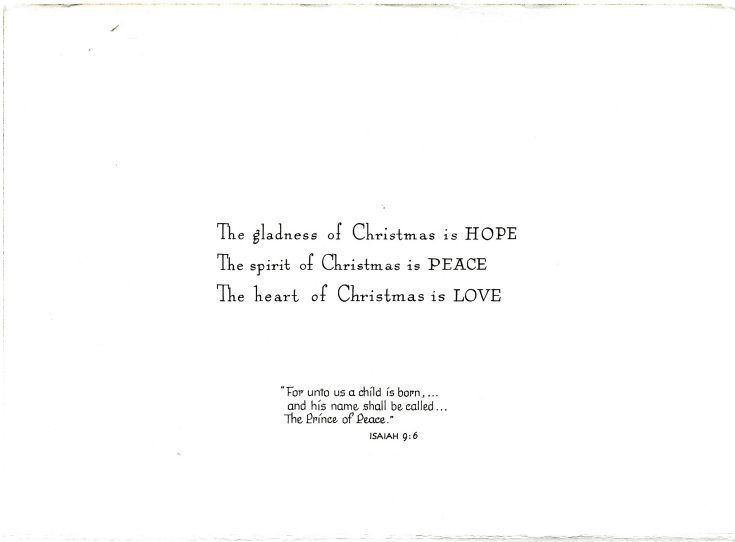
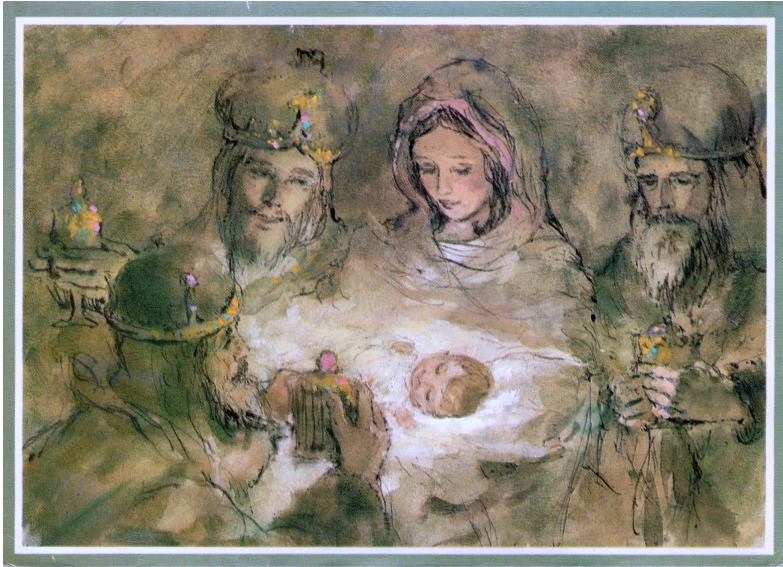
