Kolmas rivi, kolmas oikealta Iiro Mahkonen, samoin parhaita kavereitani. Kolmas rivi, ensimmäinen vasemmalta [Valto Oleniuksen](#) poika (valkea raita kauluksessa). CEDAR FALLS — West Waterloo High's trackmen took firsts in all nine running events here Wednesday afternoon to easily defeat Northern University High in high school indoor track action 74-31.

NU High's bright spot in the meet came in the field events, where the Little Panthers took three of the four events. Bob Plagge, freshman pole vaulter, went an even 12 feet to edge West's Dave Haynes. Haynes also cleared 12 feet but had more misses during the competition than Plagge. Carl Larson and Mike Lynott copped the high jump and broad jump, respectively for the Little Panthers.

West's first in the field events was in the shot, won by Daryl Morgan with a toss of 51-4½.

After the meet NU High Coach Floyd Anderson commented that his team made a "good effort" throughout the meet. West High mentor Dick Dotson had a little more to say.

"We did a good job and our attitude has improved 100 per cent. We finally got everybody out and now we'll be working towards the state indoor meet." Dotson had special praise for Dan Gates and Steve Flood.

CEDAR FALLS — North Iowa Cedar League track teams will compete in the loop indoor meet at Northern University High fieldhouse here Tuesday — and off their first win of the season, the host Little Panthers may be a strong possibility to repeat as league champs.

At least, in defeating contender Eldora and La Porte City in a triangular Friday at home, NU High displayed the overall depth which makes a contender. NU High won the meet 65-57 over Eldora with La

Porte City third with 12.

The Little Panthers took individual firsts in only three events, the shot put, mile and 440, but they had first in the medley relay and tied with Eldora for the mile relay win. And, they picked off second and third in four other events to pick up team points.

It was one of those two-three finishes that gave NU the meet. They were leading 60-52 after all the track events and all the field events except the pole vault had been completed.

Nordic Event to American Bower

OSLO, Norway (P) — John Bower, one day away from retirement, posted an unprecedented U. S. victory in the Nordic combined event of the 70th annual Holmenkollen Ski Festival yesterday.

Bower, 27-year-old ski coach at Middlebury, Vt., College, became the first American ever to win the King's Cup given by the King of Norway for the combined event and the first American ever to win any event at Holmenkollen since the festival started in 1892.

CLARKE TO RETIRE

MELBOURNE, Australia (P) — Ron Clarke, Australian distance runner who holds six world records, said Thursday he would retire after the 1968 Olympics at Mexico City.

Then, Kent Bambridge of Eldora took first in the vault with 11-0 with no misses. But Dave Plagge got second for NU High and Rick Slater third to win the meet.

NU High had gone into the lead by winning the last running event, the medley relay, as John Fish, running the anchor six laps, started his running in third behind both Eldora and La Porte City to go on to victory.

Bambridge and Steve Bolar of Eldora were the only individual double winners in the meet, originally scheduled as a dual with La Porte City, with the former taking the 50-yard dash in 5.9 in addition to his vault win. Bolar won the 50 low and high hurdles in 6.5 and 6.9 respectively.

Northern University High School had another battle with Eldora High in indoor track here Tuesday, and the Little Panthers were on top again as they successfully defended their North Iowa Cedar League indoor track title in a conference meet at the NUHS Fieldhouse.

NUHS nipped Eldora in a triangular meet here last Friday 65-57. Tuesday the Little Panthers rang up 84 points to Eldora's 70.

They set two conference records in doing it.

NU High swept all of the field events and records were broken in two of them.

Mike Lynott of NUHS won first in the broad jump, breaking that record with a 20-3/4 leap. The old conference record in that event was 20-2.

Chip Mahon of NU High broke the conference pole vault record of 12-1 1/4. Mahon vaulted 12-3 Tuesday to win that event for the Little Panthers.

In other field events, Carl Larson won the high jump and Roy Fielding won the shot put, for a couple more firsts for Northern University High.

The only individual winner for NUHS in the running events was Bill Sindlinger. He won the 3-lap run in a time of :59.3, outdistancing Eldora's Fuller.

The Little Panthers also took first place in the mile relay and the medley relay. The mile relay team is made up of Mike Lynott, Dave Penly, Gregg Hott and Bill Sindlinger, all juniors, while making up the medley relay team was Kyle Jesson, Brian Nielsen, Tim Stamp, and Don Fish.

NU High track coach Floyd Anderson was pleased with the performance of his team. "It was overall team balance that made the difference," Anderson said. "Those second and third places really helped."

CHARLES CITY — Don Gates broke a tape only once in three tries Friday, but he ran West Waterloo High to its first Comet Relays championship in history.

The Wahawks went into the final event leading Wahlert of Dubuque 41-40 and needing to finish ahead of the Golden Eagles in the mile relay to win for the first time in the meet's 23-year history.

Dike, on the other hand, had a double individual winner in Bob Tapper, who ran two heats of the 120 highs and two of the 100-yard dash inside of an hour and won both events. Teammate Dave Bern gave the Bobcats the third of their four titles when he won the 880 in record time of 2:04.5.

The meet's other double winner was Daryl Morgan, West High weight man who copped both the shot and discus.

The Wahawks won one relay to Wahlert's two, and it was Gates who got them home first in the 880. The 1:32.3 was five-tenths of a second under the school record but missed the relays mark. However, his :10.6 anchor 110 in the 440 relay that earned the Wahawks a second place was regarded as in a class with his :49.4 quarter.

Defending champion East Waterloo placed fifth in class A as Cedar Falls and Mason City tied for third with 37. Both of the latter had important members of their team in Des Moines for the Drake Relays, and the Trojans probably would have claimed third except for a mishap on one of the first races of the day.





CEDAR FALLS—Belle Plaine used four individual first places and one relay title to dethrone Northern University High of Cedar Falls as the class B district track champion at O. R. Latham Stadium here Friday evening.

Belle Plaine scored 68 points to NU High's 56. BGM of Brooklyn ended third with 38 points. 32 of them gained with first places in four of the five relays.

Belle Plaine led the Little Panthers only 52-50 with three events left. But a 2:04.0 first place 880 by Steve Wilson, a :45.7 first place in the 440 relay and a fourth place in the mile relay sewed up the meet for Belle Plaine.

NU High was able to finish second in the mile relay, mainly on the efforts of anchorman Bill Sindlinger, who was clocked in :49.4 on his anchor leg, coming from fifth to second place at the tape. BGM won the relay in 3:33.9, with NU High second in 3:36.4.

Sindlinger was also a double individual winner, as was Belle Plaine's Dave Bahr. Sindlinger clipped off a straightaway 220 in :23.6 to edge Glen Dean of Postville, then ran the 440 in :51.0 for another first place, more than a second better than the field.

Bahr won the high jump with a 6-2 lead leap, with NU High's Carl Larsen second at 5-11. Then Bahr moved to the discus and tossed it 145-5 for his double. Teammate Dan Miller won

the shot at 51-4 1/4, with NU High's Roy Fielding second at 50 1/4.

The Little Panthers earned another first place when Chip Mahon pole vaulted 13-0. The rest of the field was not able to clear more than 11-6.

Nashua picked up 22 points in the meet, helped by a pair of first places by Randy Dietz and Duane Kloster. Dietz won the long jump in 20-2 1/4 and Kloster the 180 low hurdles in :22.3.





Lahden oppikoulujen yleis-urheilumestaruuskilpailut käytiin tiistaina Radiomäen kentällä. Lyseo voitti tapansa mukaan poikien kilpailun keräten pisteitä 160 ja saaden ensimmäisen kiinnityksen uuteen Lahden Akataamisten Urheilijoiden lahjoittamaan kiertopalkintoon Salpausselän yk vei toisen sijan 84 pisteellä ja Kannas korjasi pronssin 57,5 pisteellä, seuraavina Kiveriö ja Laune 48, Yhteiskoulu 27,5 ja Mukkula 11. Kilpailujen tulostaso ei kohonnut keskinäis- ta korkeammaksi, vaikka olosuhteet olivatkin suotuisat.

Yleisöä oli yllättävän vähän Lahden kahdeksasta oppikoulusta.

Parhaista panoksista A-sarjassa vastasi Salpausselän Kyösti Sipilä, joka voitti 110 m:n aita-juoksun ajalla 15,5, sekä tiukan pituuskilvan tuloksella 625. Sadalla metrillä käytiin tiukka taisto voitosta, jonka vei Salpausselän tyylikkäästi juokseva Juhani Bask. Seuraavaksi sijoittuneille Rautjärvelle ja ilmenille merkittiin voittajan kanssa sama aika, 11,6. Korkeudessa Lyseon Göran Enckelman oli selvä voittaja tuloksella 180.
